Our monthly board meeting will follow.

Finally, I'd like to thank everyone who worked so hard over the summer to help get this year started. We have a wonderful school year ahead of us!

After spending much of the summer outdoors with my family, at the pool, in the park, and on the beach, I am refreshed and ready for September and all of its new beginnings. There are new books to read, new songs to sing, new toys to play with, and -- best of all -- new school friends!

In fact, our first learning theme for September will be Making Friends. The children have already met classmates at the August playdates and visited with me at the school. Now we will spend some time singing, reading, and playing games to get to know each other better.

During the second week of school, we will explore our first shape theme, Circles, as we bounce balls, blow bubbles, and spot circles all around us. In the third week of school, we will talk about all of the people (and pets!) in our Families. Finally, in the last week of September, our theme of Body Parts will get us up and jumping! Each week in September we will focus on a different Color of the Week, using art materials and playdough in that color, and looking around to identify things that match our color.

Meanwhile, we will also be getting familiar with the daily routine, beginning with each child "checking in" on the attendance board and being greeted at the door before choosing what to play with first. You will be amazed at how quickly the children learn the entire schedule and know just what to expect next!

Starting out in a new situation can make both children and parents feel a little anxious. However, we will work together to say calm goodbyes at the door, start the day off right with a warm welcome, and follow a predictable routine; soon we will all be adapted and ready to report back on the news of the morning. Parents can find out more about all of our activities through weekly emails from me and notes on the whiteboard outside the classroom.

## **BACK TO SCHOOL REMINDERS**

- NO NUTS! PNS is a nut aware school. This means no peanuts or tree nuts in the school, on the playground, or at school events held after hours. Please also check with your teacher and other parents in your class before bringing any snacks or treats to share.
- Please send a complete change of clothes labeled with your child's name on the first day of school. Clothes should be appropriate for the season and changed for a new set when necessary.
- Check your child's backpack each day for any important notes from teachers as well as their newly created artwork.
- Weather permitting; playground time is a part of every day. Your child should be dressed appropriately in comfortable clothing. Open-toed shoes are not a good idea for the playground since pea gravel between the toes does not feel good!
- In order to avoid hurt feelings, please leave toys at home unless requested by your teacher for show and tell.

Is everyone sufficiently bored with summer yet? Well, we've got the perfect remedy for that – a brand new school year! It's always exciting and a little scary to get together with a new group of people, but before you know it we'll all be best buddies. After we learn the daily schedule, where things go and our new friends' names, we'll feel right at home.

In addition to learning "how to go to school", we will explore a different theme each week. Our first will be Me and My New Friends. We'll play some get acquainted games and sing plenty of songs with our names in them. Next we will talk about our Families and what we like to do together. Then we'll expand our focus beyond our homes and have a week about Community Helpers.

In case you're hearing lots of "I don't know"s, when you want to know how your preschooler's day went, here are some kinds of questions you can ask:

Did you paint at the easel today?

Who's Cleo?

What story did Miss Susan read today?

Who did you sit next to at snack time?

Did you go down a slide on the playground?

What toy did you play with after circle time?

A few reminders: Please bring a backpack large enough to hold papers and art projects and check it each day for important information. Also send a complete change of seasonal clothes (shoes, too) in a resealable plastic bag with your child's name clearly printed on the outside. This will make those little accidents much easier to deal with. It's


best to wear closed-toe shoes for the playground because no one likes to stop in the middle of running around to empty pea gravel out of sandals. Take snack bags out of backpacks when you arrive in the morning and put them in the bottom of the cubby so they will be easy to grab at snack time. Toys and special treasures are best left at home so we don't have any disputes or hurt feelings.

I can't wait to get to know everyone and begin our year long relationships. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to get in touch with me. E-mail is fine or catch me after class and I truly don't mind if you call me at home.

#### MUSICAL NOTES FROM MISS ALLISON

I am so excited to be teaching music again this year! This fall we will be singing, dancing, wiggling, and making all sorts of sounds. 

Our Morning Meetings at 9:45 will have become a little more complex as we add in new kinds of greetings and games as we master each other's names.

The first week of school will be **All About Me** and we'll share our Me Bags as well as read several books where children accomplish big (and not so big) goals for themselves. Your children will be thinking of their own Hopes and Dreams for the school year. The next week of school will be **Me** and **My Family** which lead to some discussions about how our families are alike and different and activities we like to do with our families. We'll continue to work on our personal books with the pictures you sent. The last two weeks of September (and into October) we'll talk about **Our Senses**. Science exploration, process art and graphing will all be heavily featured these two weeks.

Don't forget to dress for outside play each and every day that we can be out. Water will be available at snack time, so pack a cup in the snack bag if you would like your child to partake. Parking spaces, photos and a change of clothes to be kept at school can all be given to me at Back to School Night, the abbreviated day on Thursday, September 4 or our First Day of School on Tuesday, September 9. Me Bags can be brought the first day of school.

I am so grateful to continue to be part of this fabulous co-op. I loved every moment my boys were at Providence Nursery School. I have the best memories of time spent here and I hope each of you and your children will continue to make your own wonderful memories this year. #### **TUITION**



A grace period for all payments extends through the 10th of each month. Payment not received by then is subject to a \$25 late fee. Please make your checks payable to "Providence Nursery School, Inc." Your child's name must be printed on the memo line. Put all the tuition checks in the black PNS mailbox in the hallway by the double doors to the Big Room or in the purple box in the Assistant Treasurer's mailbox in the music room. Feel free to bring September's payment to Back to School Night. Many families choose to prepay their entire tuition for the year in the September payment (and receive a 5% discount for doing so). If you would like to take advantage of this, please pay the full amount by **September 8**<sup>th</sup>. Families should have received their prepayment amounts from me via email. 
